

East Prospect Borough Council Meeting

On Tuesday, December 22, 2020, at 6:00 p.m., the East Prospect Borough Council's recessed meeting, held December 9, 2020, was reconvened.

Present: Mick Regel, Ed Gobat, Don Barshinger, Jerry Hanson, and Victor Dodson. Others in attendance: Mayor Matt Mann, Secretary Mindy Barshinger, and Treasurer Marian Hunter.

Jerry Hanson made a motion, seconded by Ed Gobat, to adopt the 2021 budget. Motion carried.

Jerry Hanson made a motion, seconded by Ed Gobat, to adopt Ordinance # 2020-2 – Tax Levy Ordinance for Fiscal Year 2021, increasing the millage to 2.27. Motion carried.

Don reported that Lt. Spangler, from PSP, contacted him and asked for a letter stating that East Prospect Borough no longer requires the services of PSP beginning January 1, 2021, due to the Borough signing a police contract with Lower Windsor Township Police Department. A letter will be drawn up and sent to Lt. Spangler stating such.

Don spoke with Teresa Weaver, the business manager of Eastern York School District, regarding paying our crossing guard for the three weeks school is out. Ms. Weaver said that the school district is not paying anyone for this time, because it is not an Act 16. If we would pay the crossing guard, Ms. Weaver said there would be no reimbursement from the school district. Consensus of Council members was that the Borough is not going to pay the crossing guard for the three weeks; she has to sign up for unemployment for those three weeks.

Problem with the truck has been resolved and is ready to go; there was a corrosion problem in the plugs.

Jerry Hanson made a motion, seconded by Victor Dodson, to adjourn the meeting. Motion carried. Meeting adjourned at 6:06 p.m.

DECLARATION OF DISASTER EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, on or about December 22, 2020, a Pandemic (COVID-19) has caused or threatens to cause injury, damage, and suffering to the persons and property of East Prospect Borough; and

WHEREAS, the Pandemic (COVID19) has endangered the health, safety, and welfare of a substantial number of persons residing in East Prospect Borough, and threatens to create problems greater in scope than East Prospect Borough may be able to resolve; and

WHEREAS, emergency management measures are required to reduce the severity of this disaster and to protect the health, safety, and welfare of affected residents in East Prospect Borough:

NOW, THEREFORE, we, the undersigned Council and Mayor of East Prospect Borough, pursuant to the provisions of Section 7501 of the Pennsylvania Emergency Management Services Code, (35 PA C.S., Section 7501), as amended, do hereby proclaim the existence of a disaster emergency in East Prospect Borough.

FURTHER, we direct the East Prospect Borough Emergency Management Coordinator to coordinate the activities of the emergency response, to take all appropriate action needed to alleviate the effects of this disaster, to aid in the restoration of essential public services, and to take any other emergency response action deemed necessary to respond to this emergency.

STILL FURTHER, we authorize officials of East Prospect Borough to act as necessary to meet the current demands of this emergency, namely: by the employment of temporary workers, by the rental of equipment, by the purchase of supplies and materials, and by entering into such contracts and agreements for the performance of public work as may be required to meet the emergency, all without regard to those time-consuming procedures and formalities normally prescribed by law, mandatory constitutional requirements excepted.

This Proclamation shall take effect immediately and last until further action of the Council.
