East Prospect Memorial Day Parade

Sunday May 24, 2015 is our annual Memorial Day Parade. It will start at Canadochly Elementary School proceed north on South Main street, make a left on Lemon Avenue, right on West Maple Street, Left on to North Main street, finishing at the Cemetery. There will be a short program at the square honoring our Veterans and current soldiers in the military. After the ceremony, there will be activities at the Town Square. This year we will have the Manhattan Dolls performing (www.themanhattandolls.com) This is a great time to get to know your neighbors and enjoys some wholesome family fun. *The road mentioned above for the parade route will be closed during the parade. Fire Police will help to direct traffic. The alternate route is Princess Avenue, which runs directly parallel to that section of North Main Street. Fire Police will help to assist the flow of Traffic. Walking Path Project

We have started the Walking Path Project. The borough has decided to move forward on its own to complete the project. We will no longer be apart of the DCNR grant. We will be planting the tree in the next couple of weeks with the ground breaking following shortly after for the walking path and the fencing for the basketball court. If you are interested in purchase 1 of the 14 trees that will be planted around the baseball field the cost will be \$300. The price includes the tree, planting and a nameplate. There will also be 6 benches available for purchase at \$500 and will be personally engraved. Please contact the borough office (717 252-0177) as soon as possible if you are interested. Street Cleaning

There will be **“NO PARKING”** on all Streets and Avenues in the Borough from 6:00 am. till 6:00pm. Any Cars, Trucks, Campers, Trailers, ect. parked on the streets Will be Fined and Towed at the Owners Expense.

Starting the week of May 10th, garbage will be collected twice a week on Tuesday and Friday through the week of September 6th. As a reminder we have unlimited recycling, unlimited 32 gallon bags 50 lbs or less, and 1 bulk item per week.

Grass Ordinance

No person, firm, partnership, corporation or other entity owning or having an interest in any real estate with the East Prospect Borough shall permit any grass that is not edible nor planted for some useful or ornamental purpose to grow or remain on such premises, including any portion of the premises occupied by a street or alley, so as to exceed a height of 3 inches. Where weeds or other vegetation are concerned, the height of such weeds and other vegetation shall be restricted to a height of 6 inches except where such weeds or vegetation are not edible or are not planted for some useful or ornamental purpose.

Spring Cleaning

It that time of year when the weather breaks and we can all do a little spring cleaning. Take this opportunity to clean up any trash or wood piles in your yard. Animals like skunks, possums, and rodents love to make homes in those piles. The Borough will be enforcing the junk ordinances and recommend you clean up any problem areas right away.

East Maple Street to become a snow emergency route

The borough is adding East Maple Street as a Snow emergency road for next winter and will be getting new street signs to alert residents.

What do I do in a snow emergency?

The snow emergency means residents must remove parked vehicles from streets marked "Snow Emergency" or they may be ticketed or towed. No warnings will be issued. Please also consider moving parked cars from streets not marked snow emergency to allow the snow plows to properly clean the streets.

The snow emergency was declared to help ensure the safety of the community by allowing the snow plows to properly clean the streets.
