IMPORTANT REMINDERS:

- As the weather warms and lawn mowers are dusted off, please remember that grass must be maintained to a height not to exceed 6 inches. Not only is tall grass unsightly, but it can provide a home for unwanted rodents.
- Complaint forms, to report ordinance violations, are available outside the borough office at 28 W. Maple St. or online at epboro.com. Form must be submitted to the borough in order for complaint to be acknowledged.
- "Poultry may only be kept in buildings erected for that purpose and must be at least 50 feet from any property line and 100 feet from any residence on adjacent property." Zoning Ordinance Section 614
- For parking violations and criminal activity call 911 NOT the borough. For obvious reasons, please do not share on social medial before contacting the police.

MISCELLANEOUS NEWS:

- There have been several recent incidents involving theft of personal property throughout
 the borough. Keeping your property secure is a simple thing to do. Keeping porch or exterior
 lights on at night is a good deterrent. Inexpensive doorbell cameras can be purchased at
 stores like Lowes or Home Depot and can be registered at
